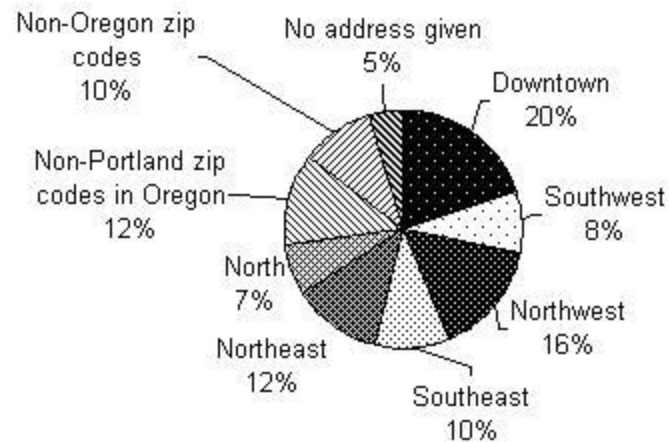
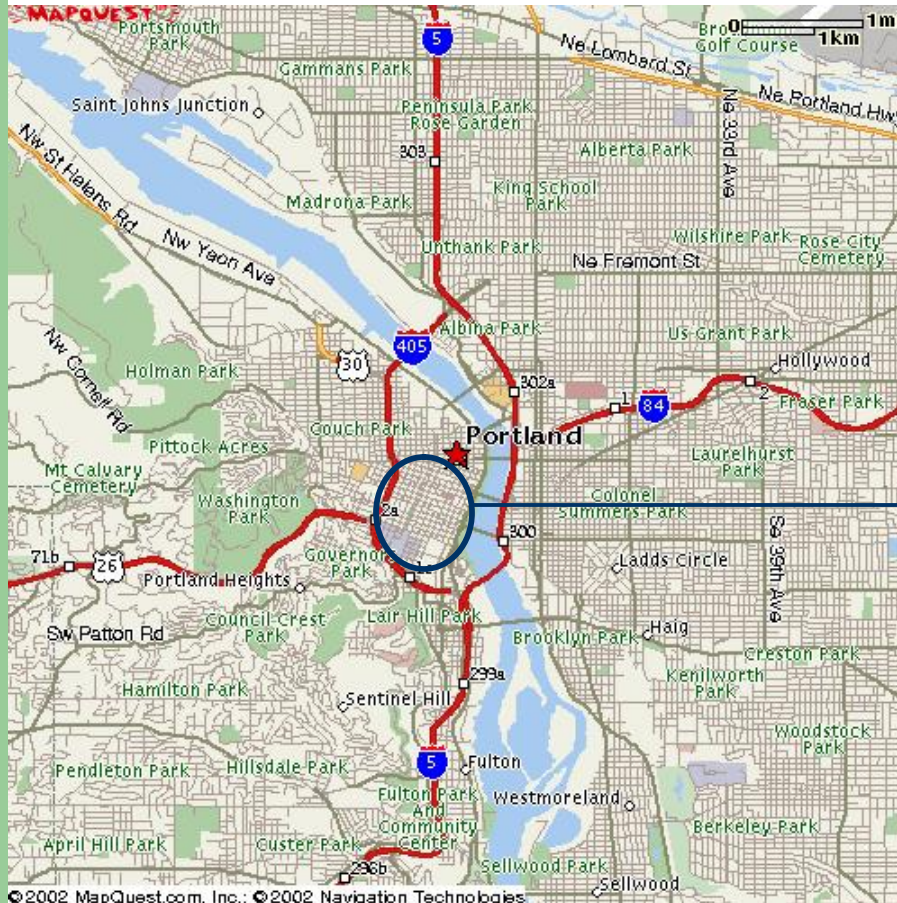

- Geographic origin of 2004 private money funding raising in Portland politics.

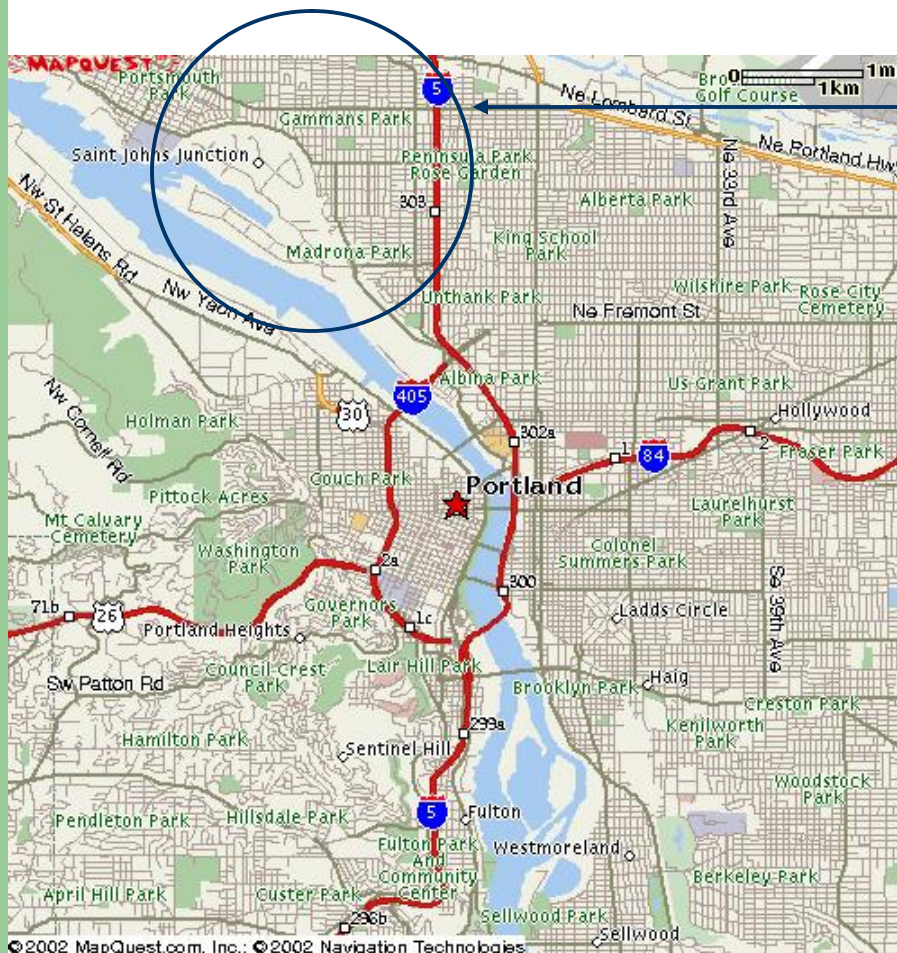

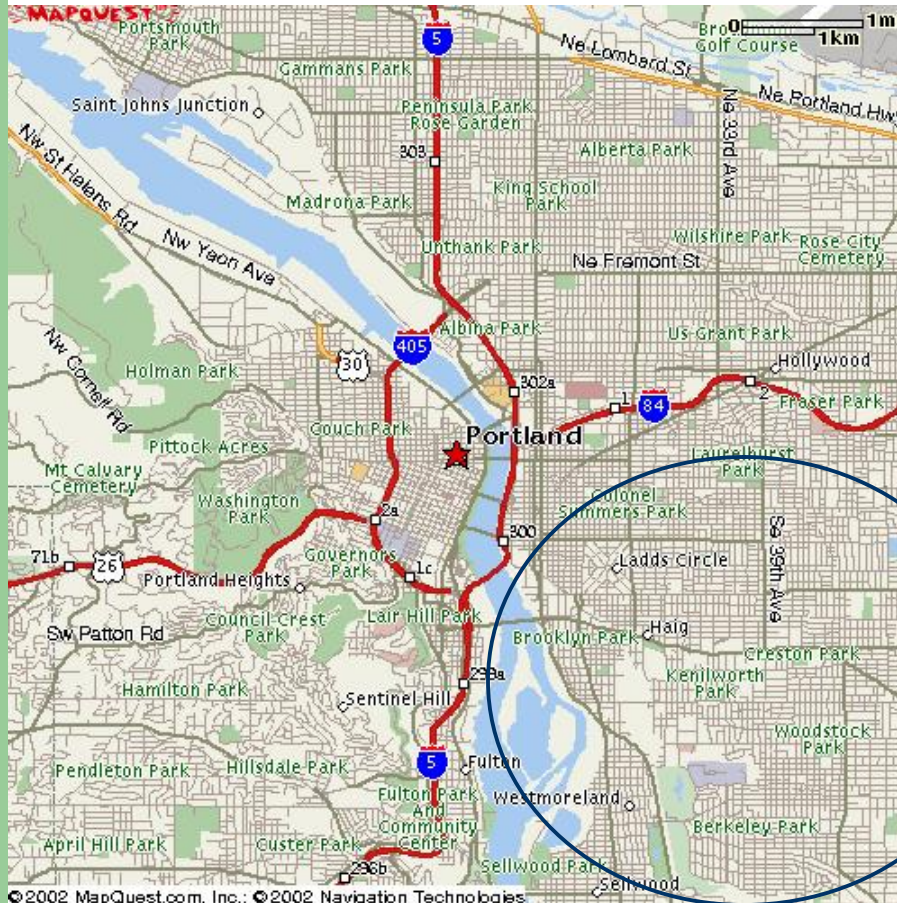

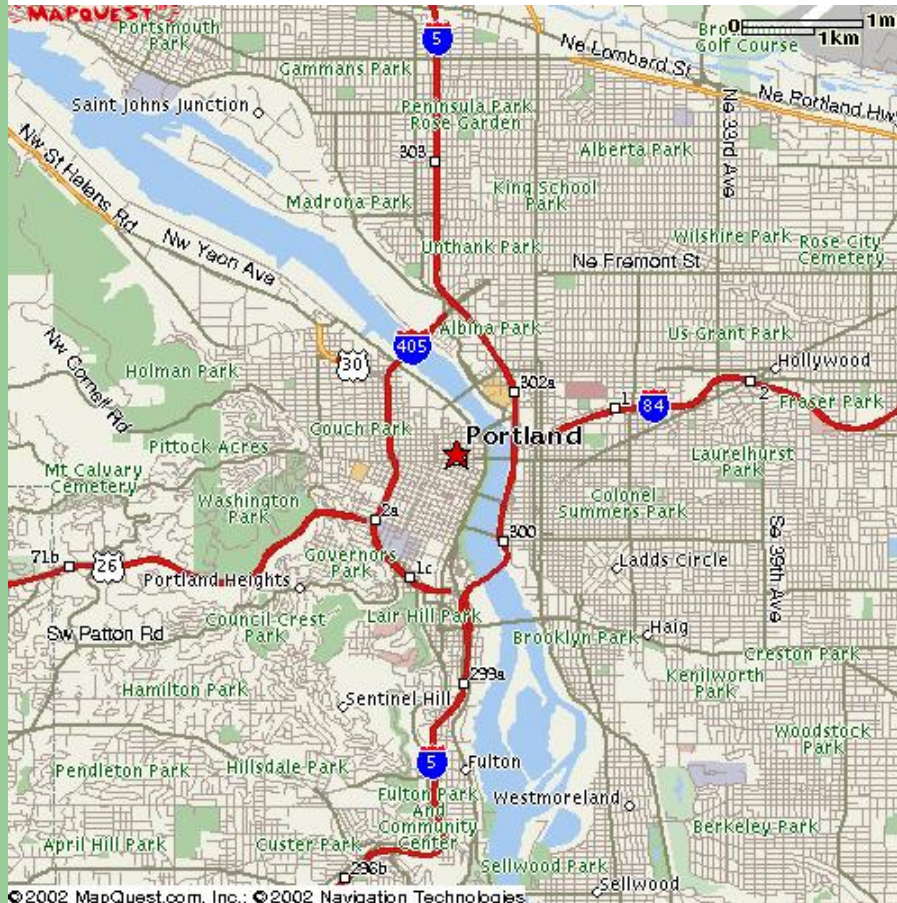

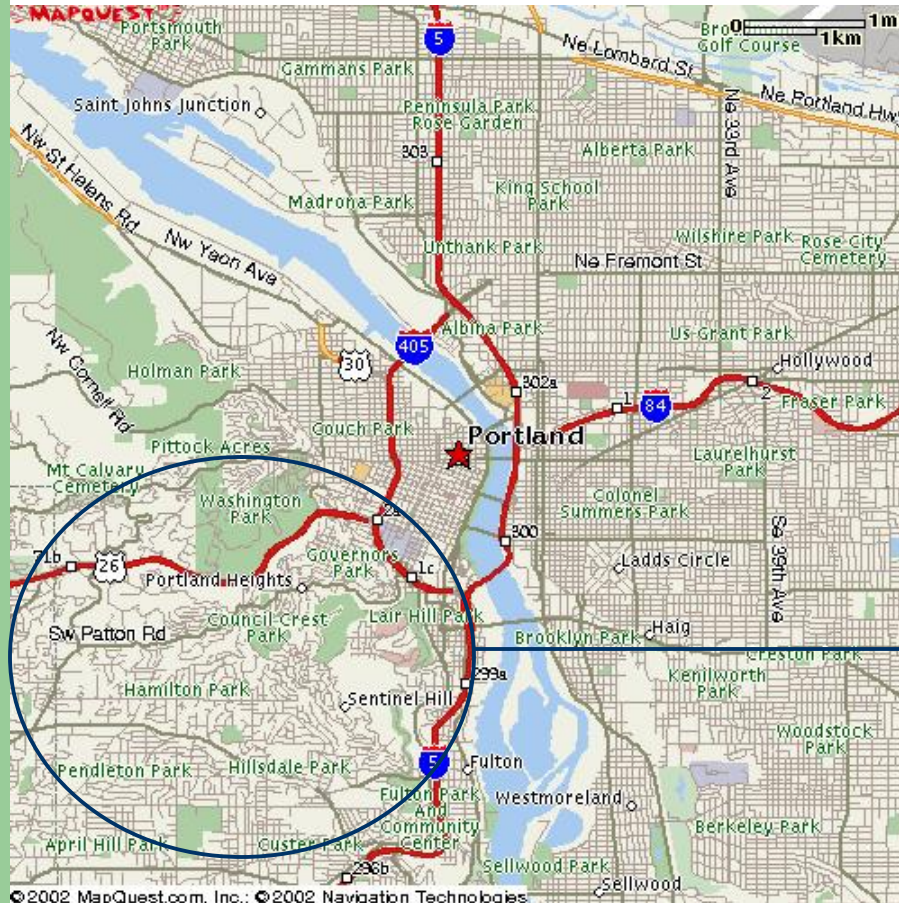

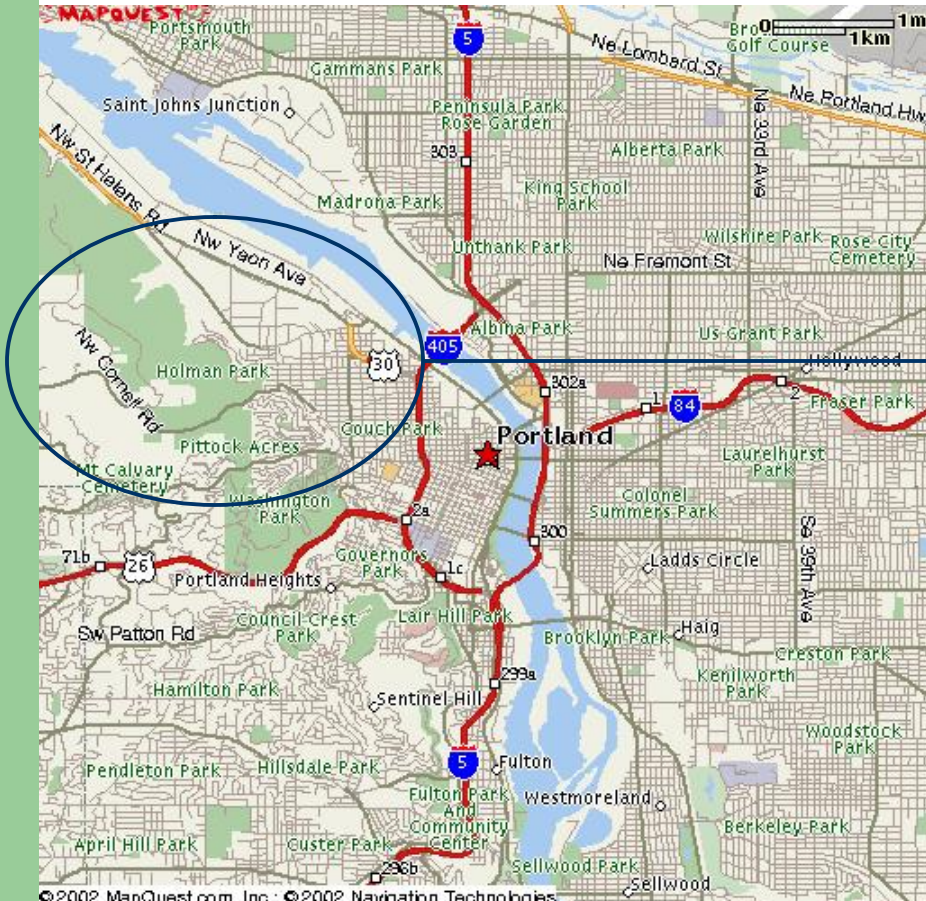

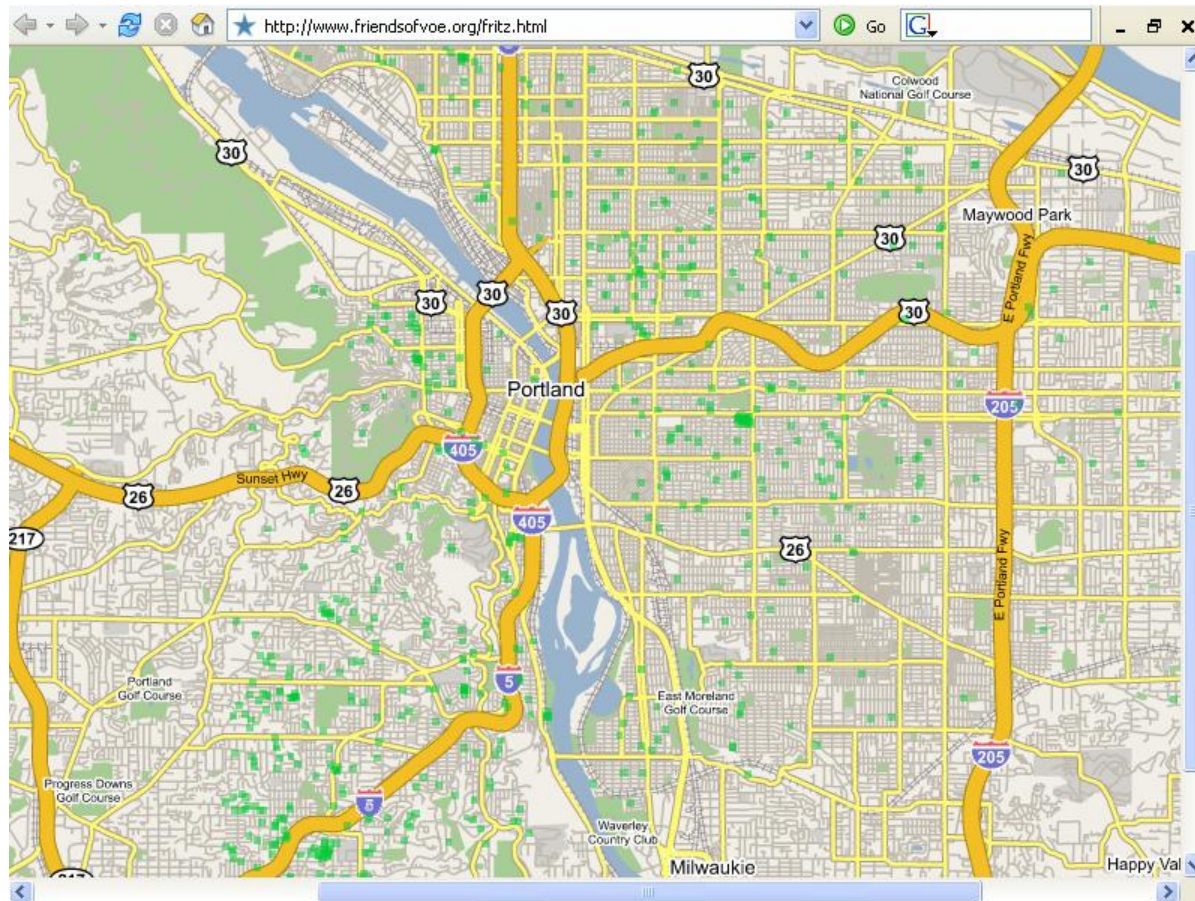

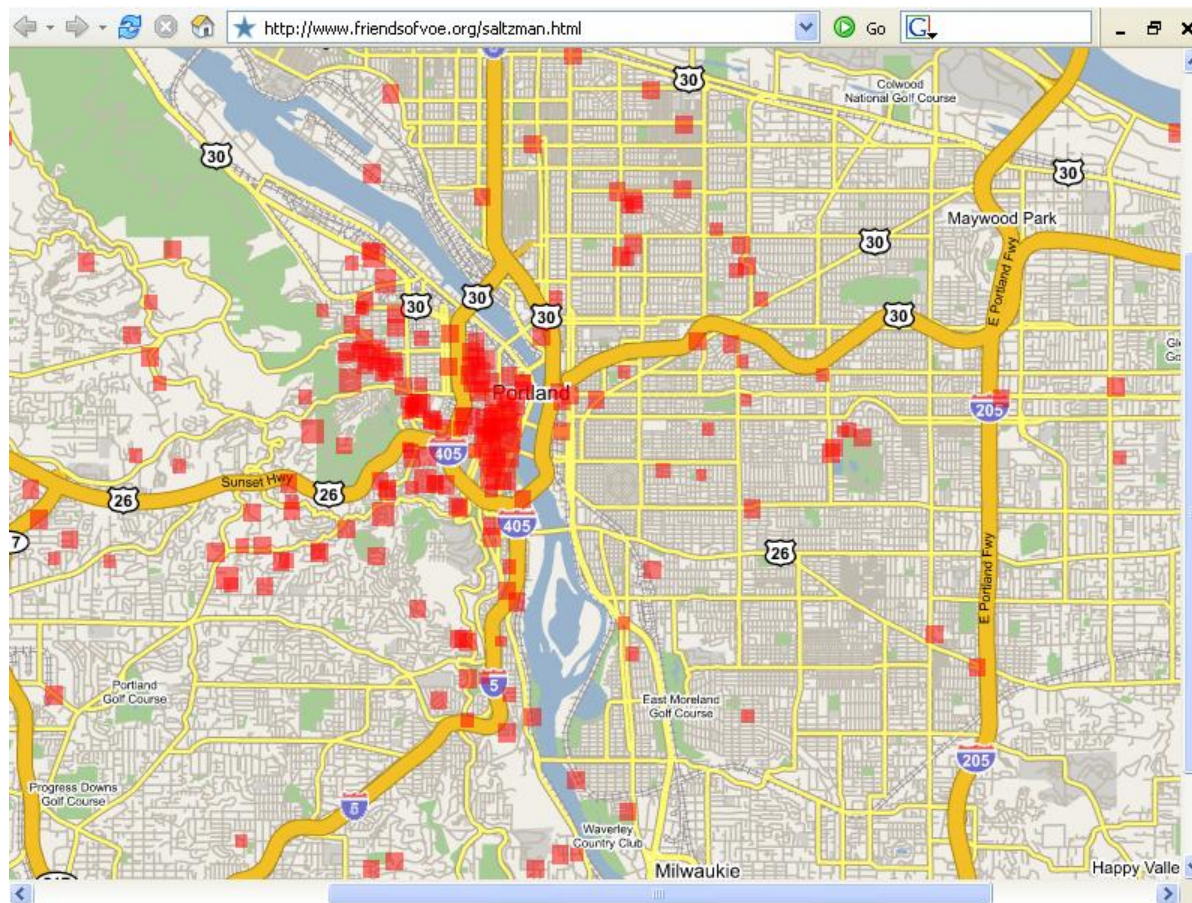
